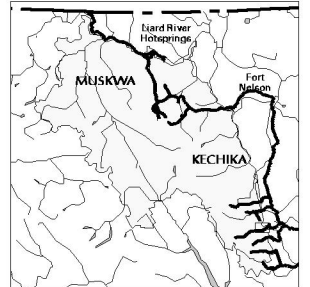
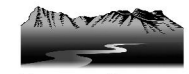


Halfway River Trail Access Routes



- Travel is restricted to within 400m of route

MUSKWA-KECHIKA
MANAGEMENT AREA

The Muskwa-Kechika (pronounced musk-quah ke-eh-eh) area is one of the most significant wilderness areas in North America. Located in north-eastern British Columbia, the 4.4 million hectare Muskwa-Kechika Management Area remains one of North America's last true wilderness areas south of the 60th parallel. The Muskwa-Kechika is managed as a special management area which allows resource development to continue while recognizing, accommodating, and protecting important wildlife and environmental values in the area.

To help meet these objectives, motor vehicle travel is limited to specific routes within the Muskwa-Kechika. These access routes have been determined on the basis of environmental sensitivity, public recommendation and past use.
