- "Continue to transform the management and stewardship of our waters, lands and resources, together with First Nations, and work toward modern land use plans and permitting processes rooted in science and Indigenous knowledge that consider new and cumulative impacts to the land base." (WLRS 2022 Mandate Letter)
- "Today, the governments of Canada and British Columbia, and the First Nations Leadership Council signed a first
 of its kind, tripartite framework agreement to protect and conserve biodiversity, habitats, and species at risk in
 the province. The Framework Agreement enables action rooted in recognition of First Nations title and rights to
 reach B.C. and Canada's goal of protecting thirty percent of lands in B.C. by 2030." (BC Gov news, Nov 3, 2023)

Modernized Land Use Planning Program Update

What is modernized Land Use Planning (mLUP)?

- mLUP is the process of establishing broad land use direction through objectives and zones for areas where
 resource economic activities could occur and where conservation areas are required, including areas specific
 for Indigenous-led initiatives.
- mLUP is a **conducted in partnership with First Nations,** on the basis of a signed G2G agreement with partner Nation(s), and consistent with the *Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act* (DRIPA).
- mLUP is a **public-facing, transparent process that includes engagement** with local governments, communities, boards, industry and stakeholders.

Land Use Planning Process





- Planning partners decision point
 - Leadership from respective governments may approve, seek additional information, or not approve the project moving ahead
 - Additional decision point(s) may be required in Plan Development

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North-eastern LUP Project – Liard Watershed Planning

- The Consensus Document commitment to land use planning in the Liard Subregional watershed
- Western boundary & First Nation overlap concerns
- New objectives & zones
- Governance & Shared Decision-making
- Cultural revitalization, language and placenaming, re-emerging legal systems

- Significant change considerations:
 - BC Hydro Wind Power call (Board advice on Wind Resource Use in the MKMA)
 - Critical minerals strategy
 - Geothermal
 - Subterranean carbon storage
 - Forest Carbon offsets revenue
- Co-management & plurality
